SCRIP PROGRAM

The Scrip Program marked its 15th year of operation in 2022, and it also hit a milestone: the church's net proceeds since 2007 have now surpassed \$40,000, including over \$2,800 this past year. There is much potential for growth, as fewer than half of our church family regularly participate in the program. Please stop by and check out our supply of on-hand gift cards each Sunday after church. We can also order scrip for any of about 500 stores, restaurants, gas stations and on-line merchants that we don't stock for immediate purchase. Orders are usually placed every Sunday afternoon, and the cards are normally delivered to Los Banos on the following Tuesday. There are dozens of retailers who also have e-scrip available, where we can purchase a gift certificate almost instantly, and either print it or email it to the recipient. For your convenience, we happily take payments by cash, check, Venmo and Zelle.

If you have been to church recently, or have watched our Sunday morning worship services online, you have likely seen our handbell choir perform beautiful special music using a newly-purchased three-octave set of handbells. This was all made possible by an extremely generous donation by Wilma Ditter, an active and devoted member of our church for the past 30 years. Wilma now resides in Merced, but she is still doing great things in support of our church. We are indeed fortunate to have her as a member of our church family.

Highlights of Charge Conference, December 3, 2022

Our annual Charge Conference was held by Zoom on Saturday morning, December 3, 2022, with 16 people present. District Superintendent David Niu presided over the meeting, beginning with a reading from Matthew 28 and talking about the call to “Make Disciples for Jesus Christ.”

The first item of business was the Membership Report, which indicated that our total membership remains at 97. Two new members were added during the past year, and fond memories were shared about George Foxworthy and Ellena Avara, who were removed by death in 2022.

Pastor Peter Suhn’s 2023 compensation package was approved as proposed by the SPRC. The salary and benefits will be the same as the prior year, but with a cost of living increase of 8.3%. Finally, with a few modifications, the Nominations Committee’s recommendations for church leadership positions for the coming year were approved.

After David Niu opened the discussion for questions, Mackenzie Ferreira gave information about the new Affiliation Agreement between the United Methodist Church and the Boy Scouts. Our church will no longer be sponsors of the Scouts, but they will still be able to use our facilities, requiring some forms to be signed in the near future by church leaders.

As there were no other questions, David Niu thanked everyone for coming and closed the Charge Conference with a blessing.
